It is the writer's belief that your office is familiar with the Fields Federal IX drilling in Northwestern Arizona, Section 17, Township 38 North, Range 7 West. At this time, I hold a labor lien on the leases for services rendered during the deepening of the above well last winter. It was my hope that the very promising shows encountered in the first drilling and then in a freak formation in the second could be brought to the attention of persons in a position to provide the capital necessary for a thorough testing of the deeper zones. This did not prove possible nor did Mr. Fields' financial position make it possible for him to go on drilling or even to test the zones already encountered.

In addition to my lien for labor while managing the well, Charles W. Branch of Aztec holds a second lien in the amount of, roughly, seven thousand dollars. It is my intention to see that he is paid, and to this end, as well as to work further towards the development of the oil and gas possibilities of the Strip, I have only today proposed to Mr. Fields the following plan:

Mr. Fields is to make an assignment of his leases to me as an American citizen, in return for which, I will assume the debt to Mr. Branch and give him \$2,500 cash at the time of the signing over of the leases # 014311 and 014312, not however, absolving him from his present obligation to log, plug and abandon, according to the form he has filed with Mr. Maulle in Phoenix. Mr. Fields is to retain a 5% overriding royalty, being the amount which may legally be recorded. I believe that this is the best arrangement which can be made and it is doubly desirable as the group sponsoring my move intends to drill a deep test on the Fields leases. I sent Mr. Fields a lengthy wire to this effect and also made a telephone call to him at his home. He seemed

still to hope that he can outwait the six months' period for foreclosure of the liens, which ends in December, 1960, and that he will be able to keep his bonds and renew his leases from the government. It is not my intention to allow this period to pass without action. I want you to know that I repeatedly urged Mr. Fields to live up to his obligations, most of all to notify you when he intended to start the second well. His action in spudding in without a permit came as a surprise to me and caused me to resign from the management of the well.

I have in my possession at this time all the pertinent data on Federal IX and its deepening. I have no interest in any promotional scheme, but only in actual drilling and testing of the horizons to the basement complex. This can only be done by a team of professionals, and not in the haphazard way in which Fields' Federal IX was handled by him. Haliburton was called in only after the well had been thoroughly wrecked. During my work on the deepening of the well, I at no time had the necessary authority from Mr. Fields, nor was there sufficient capital available to employ geologists and engineers. I secured the services of Cloyd Swapp, an excellent geologist, but as there was only \$100.00 available to pay him, he very generously consented to run a micro leg for us in his spare time but could not run out to the well for so paltry a sum.

I feel that it would be very wrong for the driller, Charles W. Branch, not to receive his just and due payment, simply because it may prove difficult and costly to foreclose the liens. We would prefer to settle the matter quickly and amicably and to get on with the drilling. My group wishes to be free of any connection with Mr. Fields and to pay the driller for his past performance before starting another well to basement complex. I will be very grateful to you for your advice in this matter and for letting me know where the government stands at this time both from a legal standpoint and in their general attitude.
